Why Communion Every Week @ FCC?

At Communion, Christians meditate upon the sacrifice of Jesus for their salvation. They examine themselves to ascertain if they have grown in the grace and knowledge of Christ during the past week. They reaffirm their covenant with God: to love Him with all their heart, soul, mind, and strength. Communion is the only way Jesus Himself asked to be remembered. Let us come together on this Lord's Day – every Lord's Day – to remember and celebrate His mercy in the

Lord's Supper as we commune together.

"The Lord Jesus on the same night in which He was betrayed took bread; and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said, 'This is My body which is broken for you; do this in remembrance of Me.' In the same manner, He also took the cup after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in My blood. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me.' For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death till He comes." (1 Cor 11:23-26) Together We Grow – FCC's Daily Devotion and Prayer Guide (Author initials are at the end of each entry.)

Sun, Apr 14: Freely Given

"Let us, therefore, come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need." (Heb 4:16) What is grace? One definition states that grace is "God's favor towards the unworthy." Grace cannot be earned; it is freely given. Jesus understands our weaknesses; He understands our struggles and temptations. Christ was tempted and remained sinless. Because of His grace, He forgives and continues to bless us even when we fail. Grace is the reassurance that He will offer us mercy and compassion. (TW) Prayer Guide: Pray FCC trusts in God's unfailing grace.

Mon, Apr 15: A Life Worthy of Him

"So then each of us shall give account of himself to God." (Rom 14:12)

The Bible teaches us that we will be held accountable before God for every aspect of our lives. However, most of us want to present ourselves in a way that others won't find offensive. We aren't held accountable to our critics nor by their standards for our lives. We need to stop focusing on what we do that offends others and focus on living our lives in a way that doesn't offend God. Live a life worthy of Him. (TW) Prayer Guide: Pray FCC walks worthy of their calling in Christ.

Tue, Apr 16: The Power of Prayer

"Confess your trespasses to one another, and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The effective, fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much." (Jas 5:16)

Have you ever told someone that you would keep them in your prayers? This could be for a spiritual or physical need. The prayers of a righteous person are very powerful because God hears them. Not only does He hear, but He also acts. So, the real question is this, when you told someone that you would pray for them, did you? Prayers work and are effective if you just practice what you preach. (TW) Prayer Guide: Pray FCC effectively and fervently prays for one another.

Wed, Apr 17: God Can Change the Scale

"For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, is working for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory." (2 Cor 4:17)

Look at the words "weight of glory" and picture the ancient pan-scale blindfolded lady of justice. Holding a pan scale: two pans with one on each side of the needle. The weight of the purchase is determined by placing weights on one side and the purchases on the other side. God does the same with our struggles. He stacks our burdens on one side. Picture how the pan scale dips. Watch God's response. Does He remove them? No, He cancels them out. He places an eternal weight of glory on the other side. Endless joy, measureless peace, an eternity of Him. Picture what happens as He sets eternity on your scale. Everything changes, the burdens lift, and the heavy becomes light when weighed against eternity. (RR)

Thu, Apr 18: A Glorious Future

"But may the God of all grace, who called us to His eternal glory by Christ Jesus, after you have suffered a while, perfect, establish, strengthen, and settle you." (1 Pet 5:10)

Through the refining process, He establishes our faith and settles our hearts in His peace.
